The Vanuatu Environmental Science society was the only implementing partner in this project.

Conservation Impacts

Summarize the overall impact of your project, describing how your project has contributed to the implementation of the CEPF ecosystem profile

This was a capacity building grant and overall VESS has grown from a very small organisation with no office or employees to a known organisation in Vanuatu with an office, 3 Ni-Vanuatu employees and an Australian volunteer. We are now invited to government meetings as a stakeholder and have contributed to policies such as the banning of single-use plastics and the unique and special marine areas of Vanuatu and the National Biodiversity Strategy and Action Plan (NBSAP). We are working closely with the Department for Environmental Protection and Conservation and with the Vanuatu Fisheries Department. We also have good relationships with the Department of Forests and the Vanuatu Cultural Centre. We have been invited to participate workshops in Vanuatu and overseas and been asked to be consortium partners with other organisations in joint projects.

The project officers have gained experience in the workforce. Martika Tahi in particular has worked well and gained experience in delivering workshops and report writing. She has been mentored by Christina and Alex, VESS'sAustralian Volunteer. She was accompanied to the

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workshops by Alex in Tongoa and Aneityum and then organised and led the workshops entirely in Futuna.

The environmental awareness components of this project have gone well. We have produced factsheets on the CEPF prioritised threatened species and KBAs in Vanuatu. They are published on the VESS website. We were told that they have been used by UK filmmakers researching threatened species in Vanuatu in order to make documentary. An exhibition was held earlier this year showcasing these species factsheets. They have also been printed and distributed to the communities where workshops have taken place. Workbooks were also written to accompany the workshops and these materials have been left in the communities for future reference. The workshop were mostly well attended and despite delays and challenges of working in remote communities, most of the objectives were achieved. The teachers workshops in Tongoa and Futuna were just a couple short of the target but the targets for community attendance was well exceeded in all three islands.

Describe the success or challenges of the project toward achieving its short-term and long-term impact objectives

There appears to be a genuine thirst for knowledge about the environment and a willingness to try to conserve amongst most of the outer island communities and those in Port Vila and this has helped us to reach out to more of the community with our awareness activities. The VESS team has been welcomed wherever we have worked in Vanuatu.

It has been challenging to employ capable personnel in Vanuatu to perform the tasks required in this project. Even those with degrees in natural sciences have needed significantly more mentoring than initially thought. However Martika Tahi has proven to be a valuable and capable employee. There are always logistical challenges and weather related delays in Vanuatu, particularly when working on the outer islands. Spending only a short time on the islands working with local communities, whilst necessary for economic reasons, it is not always easy to achieve all the planned activities and flexibility is required. These factors have led to delays and changes in plans but despite this most of the objectives and planned activities have been achieved.

Were there any unexpected impacts (positive or negative)?

Our data collection of litter surveys has influenced the policy on banning of single use plastic in Vanautu which has come into force this year. The data from our clean ups was used by government to decide on what items should be banned in the first round of regulations. Media attention from overseas about the ban has lead to journalists seeking interviews with VESS and subsequently raised our profile.

VESS has only been established for just under 4 years. This capacity building grant was a follow on from a small grant from CEPF which was used to start VESS. We have used this grant to create a base and an office and to establish VESS as a local conservation organisation in Vanuatu and a source of information on environmental issues and particularly threatened species. During the project we have learnt valuable lessons on the best methods to impart information on threatened species to communities in remote areas as well as the urban population in Port Vila.

One of VESS's goals is to engage the public in citizen science project. Our goal is to encourage people to gather data and record what they see and find and to demonstrate the power of data to highlight a problem or a need. The international coastal clean up is one of the citizen science project we engaged in during the lifetime of this CEPF grant. The data gathered during the litter cleanups made people who were engaged in the clean ups really think about what they found. The report on the clean up was also used by government as evidence of the scale of the littering problem and the kinds of litter found on the streets. The report directly influenced the types of litter included in the regulation to ban plastic shopping bags, polystyrene take away containers and plastic straws.

This grant has given VESS valuable experience in proposal writing, project implementation and report writing. It has allowed VESS to network and collaborate with government and other organisation involved in conservation in Vanuatu. VESS is now regularly invited to stakeholder meetings and policy consultations of government departments and other organisations.

Sustainability / Replication

VESS is now a well established organisation with employees and volunteers. One aim of the project was to create an environment where VESS is able to apply for and successfully obtain further funding

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for conservation projects in Vanuatu. This aim has been achieved and VESS should now be able to continue to seek funding to implement conservation projects into the future. We have established a good reputation and created relationships with communities in the areas where we work as well as with government and other NGOs. Logistic of project implementation and disseminating information in Vanuatu is a challenge due to the geography and limited transport links within the country. However implementing this project has enabled us to establish our methodologies for successfully delivering information to the communities in Vanuatu for this project and in the future projects.

The information on the CEPF priority species contained in the fact sheets created under this project is available for all on the VESS website www.vanuatuconservation.org. The fact sheets are freely available to all and can be used for education or conservation projects in the future. They will be updated by VESS as more information becomes available, such as with photos and information collected on our recent expedition to research the Bank's Flying Fox.
